

Student Union Malmö's operational plan 2019/2020

§1 Introduction

Student Union Malmö's operational plan is the Student Council's task for the board. The operational plan is an important component of what the Student Union Malmö works with.

The operational plan's structure begins with the Union's daily work, from regular operations to recruitment to study social and study political work. This will be supplemented by focus areas, where Student Union Malmö's work is defined and put to goals. The various sections of the operational plan have been written by different authors but have two editors, with previous Student Union council having the chance to give feedback. The operational plan is written in such a way that it is not too narrow in its task to the next board nor too broad in order to reach the goals.

§ 2 Regular operations

The Union's structure has been more or less unchanged during an amount of years even though the university has grown and changed. During the operational year 17/18 Student Union Malmö started a re-organisation with some changes in the administration as well as the board. The work with re-organisation has continued during the operational year 18/19 by looking into the work tasks and areas of responsibilities within the board.

The purpose of these changes has been to develop the operations and to make the Union's work more long-term and effective while taking into consideration the university's future development. To ensure that these previously done or suggested changes will be followed through and implemented within the organisation, the development of the Union's structure should therefore continue under the upcoming operational year. A part of the continued work with the regular operations should include the new work division and the implementation of committees under board members, which are part of the re-organisation.

A part of the Union's regular operations concerns the Union house's future physical location. It is yet unclear where and in what form the future Union house will be, which influences both the board and all the associations' operations. It is of utter importance that the work for finding a convenient building for the Union's current and future operations continues and is prioritised.

- Keep an active discussion with Malmö university and Malmö city regarding the future of the Union's house

§ 3 Recruitment, engagement and closeness to the students

Student engagement plays a pivotal role in the Student Union Malmö's daily work. To ensure that the Union keeps its relevance as such, we must create stable recruitment and well-implemented routines in regards to how student engagement is encouraged and rewarded. To do this, we must continuously create and develop strategies for high student engagement. Both study political and study social aspects are crucial for the Student Union Malmö's continued development. The former aspect secures stronger student influence within Malmö University and develops the students' knowledge and competence. The latter aspect enriches the students' social life and cultural experience.

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§ 4 Study political work

Students' lives are touched everyday by different decisions, some more political than others. However, we want to safeguard the rights of students and their well-being. In order to do this, we must engage politically with university and the surrounding society while simultaneously engaging students in the process.

- Together with Studentcentrum, CAKL, and the library work to increase the knowledge of supportive functions for students, which provide for example mentors, language, math workshops and lectures about study techniques
- To shed light on the different support functions that exist at the university and emphasize on the importance of them
- By offering events where students can learn more about the student life

§ 5 Study social work

The Student Union Malmö chooses to focus its study social work on conditions for social life and the possibilities to have rewarding leisure time. The study social work that is done by the Student Union Malmö shall be inclusive and welcoming and has the purpose of creating a feeling of community for the students in Malmö. Furthermore, the Union holds the belief that a good balance between social and academic life brings about an improved mental health. The beginning of the semester is always filled with lots of introductory study social events and information about support functions. The social aspect of introduction is very important, especially on the first academic year, when students are finding their way, but it is as important that students have a steady social life throughout their studies.

§ 6 Focus areas

The focus areas for the operational plan have been selected after an assessment, done by the board and council 18/19, on the most significant questions which came up during the year.

At the same time, the board has included certain aspects from the old focus areas that the operational plan 18/19 had - Internationalisation, digitisation, academic literacy, housing, as these are major recurring issues that the Union should continue to work with.

Focus areas for operational year 19/20 have been decided to be the following:

- Mental health
- Pedagogy
- Student representatives
- Malmö Student city

§ 6.1 Mental health

Mental health issues are more widespread in society, especially among the younger population which is studying in higher education. According to studies, almost half of the students in Sweden have experienced worsened mental health over the course of their education. This can manifest itself in a number of instances such as high levels of stress, anxiety, depression, and more. The Union shall shed light on the aspects which can contribute to mental health issues. These can be studies, housing, economic situation, loneliness, cases of discrimination and more.

Mental health is as important as physical health and thus should be treated with the same level of seriousness and urgency as any other illness - proactively in order to have good mental health and reactively in order to support the students whose mental health has worsened.

- Discuss mental health openly in different fora such as KMK, social media, the Toilet Paper and meetings with the university
- Shed light on the link between mental health and other aspects of (student) life through debate articles, workshops and more
- Work to communicate support functions clearly

§ 6.2 Pedagogy

The question of pedagogy is a consistent and important part of higher education. Pedagogy isn't only addressing teaching methods, but is a rather broad and extensive area that connects teaching methods, examination process, learning environment, the interaction between teachers and students in that environment and all the questions and issues that can be connected to those, such as accessibility, safety, widened participation and recruitment, equal treatment and other aspects of the education. Student Union Malmö thinks that all aspects of pedagogy are equally important and hang together, thus should all be taken into consideration while working with this big question.

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Student Union Malmö will continue to actively participate in the design and development process of learning environments at Malmö University

- Ensure student influence in the various parts of the university that handle learning environment issues
- Push for a more digitalised education as a whole when it is pedagogically wiser to do so
- Make sure that the learning process is accessible for everyone, when it comes to both physical and digital learning environments
- Concentrate not only on the aspects of teaching and class time, but instead look at the education as a whole, while connecting it to learning environment

Student Union Malmö thinks that pedagogy within the university as a whole should continuously develop and improve

- Increase the Union's knowledge on pedagogy in order to ensure the student influence regarding these questions and support students interested in them, for example, stay informed on international and national research on university education
- Encourage the university to develop a meeting place for discussions on pedagogy between employees and students

§ 6.3 Student representatives

Strong student influence requires active student representatives. That is why it is important that the group of representatives is as heterogeneous as possible and from all the respective faculties in order to best represent all the students towards the university. Student representatives can be elected via Student influence FORUM, or for example in class to be course representatives. Student Union Malmö wants to support all student representatives to be best equipped as possible to meet the challenges ahead, and to make the role of student representative more attractive. Furthermore, the Union wants to improve the function of the local student councils, which are meant to be a junction of the work of the student ombud and the student representatives of the respective faculty.

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§ 6.4 Malmö Student City

Malmö university is the youngest university in Sweden. Malmö does not have as established traditions as other universities and student cities. Instead of it being seen as a downside, we can make the most out of it and be part of creating traditions. We can involve our students in the process of finding out what they want from their city and their university. Students should have the best possible conditions during their studies, and we want to ensure that these are met on each front. We can work for better housing conditions, student influence, social activities and many more. Some of the work that helps ensuring better conditions for a good student city has already been described before in the operational plan, however we will mention here a few other perspectives.
