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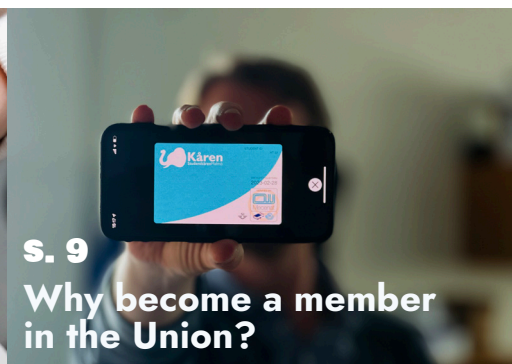

CHECKLIST

- things to get done your first week

At the beginning of the semester, there are a lot of things to do, a lot of new things to learn and a lot to keep track of. To make things a little easier for you as a new student, we've put together a checklist of the most important things you should do to get off to the best possible start.

1. Find somewhere to stay

Finding accommodation is often the first problem to solve. We know that the housing situation for students in Malmö is difficult, but we've put together some tips that we hope will help. **Read our tips on finding accommodation on the next page: Where should you live?**

2. Register in Malmö

Register your accommodation in Malmö. When you do this, you help to raise funds to pay for the range of cultural, leisure and service activities for you and everyone else who lives in Malmö. The service is free and you can read more at skatteverket.se/privat/folkbokforing.

3. Get a computer ID

You will use your computer identity throughout your studies to log in to computers, access the wireless network and Canvas. You must order your computer identity before you can register for your course. You do this at ids.mau.se/Onboarding.

4. Get a multi-card

The multi-card is used as an access card in the university buildings, a library card and for printing, scanning and copying. Order your multi-card directly when you have received your computer identity, delivery time can be up to 14 days. **More info at student.mau.se when you search for "multi-card".**

5. Get a Wi-Fi account

To connect to the University's wireless network, you need to create a Wi-Fi account. With Eduroam you can also access the internet when you are at other universities, colleges and some public places. You can find a guide on how to do this at student.mau.se/stod/it-service/tradlost-natverk.

6. Be a member in the Union

Become a member of the Union to get more out of your student life. Go to malmostudenter.se/member or visit our reception. At your roll call, there will also be union representatives at the faculties so that you have the opportunity to become a member on site. A full-year membership costs SEK 198, and a semester costs SEK 99. **Read more on page 9.**

7. Literature scholarship

At the start of a course, there are often many new course books that need to be purchased and it puts a strain on an already thin student wallet. Now is your chance to apply for the Student Union Literature Scholarship - a grant of SEK 500 that is awarded to three union members at the start of the semester. **Read more on page 15.**

8. Get a bike

Cycling is an easy way to get around Malmö and it's also cheaper and more environmentally friendly than the bus! Check out the City of Malmö's bicycle auctions for bike bargains, or sign up for an annual subscription at rent a bike at malmobybike.se.

9. Join Insparken (kick-off)

During Insparken, you as a new student will have the chance to participate in a variety of activities. During this time you will also meet mentors who will answer your questions about the Union, Malmö and the university. **Read more on the previous page.**

10. Join an association/section

At the Student Union, there is something for everyone, whether you like singing and dancing, or games, parties and foreign policy. In the unlikely event that you don't find a student group, association or section for your program, you can create one yourself! Isn't that great? For more informa-

11. Say hello to your ombud

Our student representatives work to ensure that you have a good time studying, always. You can get to know the representative of your faculty at their faculty office. This way, you will recognize them and vice versa when you meet them at the faculties if you need to ask something about your studies.

12. Keep up to date

FIND ACCOMMODATION

- Helpful reading tips

Malmö is an interesting and dynamic city where much has happened and changed in recent years. The university has left its mark and so has the Öresund Bridge; our connection to Copenhagen and the rest of the world.

Malmö is not only a student city, which is also reflected in the housing market with a relatively low number of student housing. Therefore, it is good to look for housing in Malmö with open eyes, you may not end up in a regular student corridor first but in other options such as shared, private room in someone else's house or apartment sublet apartment, rental apartment or condominium.

Malmö does not have a campus, but student accommodation is scattered throughout the city. To give an overview of the different accommodation options the city has to offer, Malmö University has put together a list with contact details of the main housing agencies, sublets and hostels, check it out at mau.se/utbildning/bostad

On the Union's website malmmostudenter.se/bostad we have gathered most housing agencies in the region, where you can also find some smaller agencies that not as many people know about and where the competition may be less.

Together with jagvillhabostad.nu, we have created a housing guide with all the tips you might need when looking for housing in Malmö, which you can find on our website (**scan the QR-code further down**).



There are a whole host of secondary market sites. One of the biggest is blocket.se, where many private individuals choose to post ads. These are often temporary sublets or private rooms in someone's apartment or house, but it might be the perfect solution if you're only going to be studying in Malmö for a short time, or if you're looking to live with other people.

Another tip is to register in Malmö's housing agency's joint housing queue, boplatssyd.se. It costs 300 SEK per year for a place in the queue, but in exchange you only have one place to keep track of. Here it is important to be out in good time if you want a central one-bedroom, two-bedroom or

student accommodation. On the other hand, demand is not as great if you can imagine living on the outskirts of town or joining forces with other students to rent a larger apartment together.

The Union's housing portal

The Student Union also has its own agency for secondary accommodation on hemma.malmmostudenter.se, where private individuals post their ads. However, be careful when you rent through private individuals! It is easy to fall victim to scammers so remember not to send money in advance, in general, you should avoid landlords who require you to pay in advance before you have seen the accommodation.

The Union's Sofa project

If you've tried all the options and are still without a roof over your head when the semester starts, there is also the emergency solution of sleeping on someone else's couch. The Union has the Sofa Project, where we work to find temporary beds for students by mediating contacts between incoming students and volunteers who are prepared to provide a bed. This way, you gain some time to find a more permanent accommodation.

Study more efficiently with the right **STUDY TECHNIQUE**

With an accurate study technique, your studies will become more efficient, easier, and more fun! Putting some initial efforts in adopting the right study skills will benefit you for the rest of your life. Here we present various tips on studying and whom to contact if you want further information or individual support.

University studies differ in many ways from high school studies. University studies are driven by each student's individual responsibility for his or her study situation, with less supervised lectures, multiple overlapping group projects, and extensive course literature. It can be difficult both to adjust to the new settings and demands and to organize your time so that you get 40 hours per week dedicated to studies and lectures. What happens if I miss a lecture? How much do I have to read each day? Do I have to read everything? These are common questions to deal with when becoming a university student.

We all have our individual way to learn new things. Some of us learn by listening, others by watching, and others learn best by doing. No way is more efficient than the other - just different. That is why it is important to think through previous learning occasions and to find out what learning looks like for you, so that you can adjust your study technique accordingly!

Even if you are excited about your new studies, things sometimes does not work out as you've planned. If so, it can be a relief to have someone to turn to for advice and support. The Study and Career Counseling center organizes individual counseling and workshops in study and learning techniques. If you don't feel secure with your study techniques and learning skills, it can lead to feelings of stress and anxiety.

It can be difficult to find the right balance between studies and social activities, with the consequence of falling behind the schedule (or the opposite: not having time for anything else besides the studies!). Neither situation is ideal and either situation could harm your health and wellbeing. If you need help with these types of issues, you are welcome to contact the Student Health Service.

They will provide you with good advice and accurate support for your individual situation. The Student health service also arranges workshops in how to overcome speech anxiety.

We have put together some general tips and suggestions on how to start improving your learning skills and study technique:

1. Look over your study environment

That is, the place where most of the learning happens. Malmö University offers different types of environments: group rooms and common spaces for studying at your faculty and school library, quiet reading rooms, and open spaces like cafés. At the Union there are spaces for studying, even study rooms for you or your study group. The study environment has a huge impact on your study results, and it is crucial that you find the environment best suited for you. The majority find it easiest to focus when it is quiet and calm, but some of us find it helpful with music playing or just a surrounding "buzz".

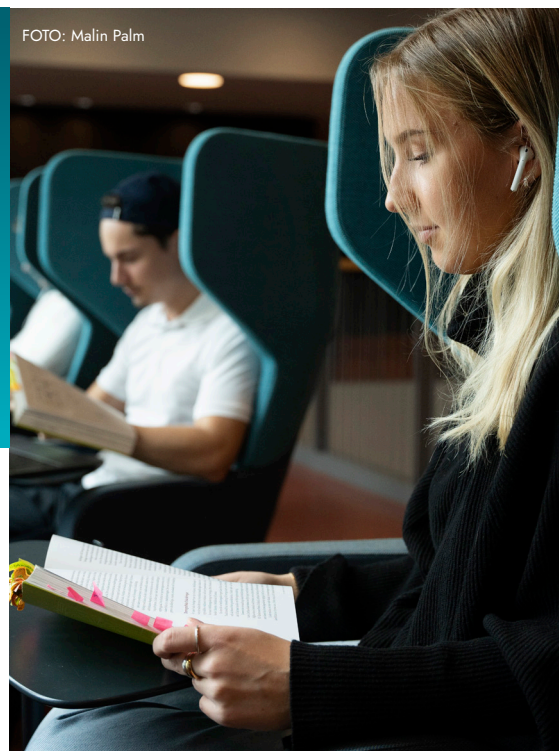
2. Motivation

Make it a habit to remind yourself why you want to study and remind yourself about the end goal. Use this technique when finding it hard to start reading your course literature: what do you gain from reading this book or article? More useful advice is to start with the general picture before digging into details. Look through the table of contents and the chapter outlines, browse through the book, read whatever catches your eye, and look for summaries. This makes it easier to understand the main message of the book and you can focus on what parts and chapters are relevant for your aims.

3. Active reading

Try to make the reading as active as possible by underlining important passages and key concepts. Make your own summary of your underlining and go back to

it before the exam.

4. Taking breaks

Don't forget to take a break every now and then! Most people can keep focus and concentration for 30 to 45 minutes at a time, so make sure you take smaller "leg stretchers" instead of a few longer breaks. That will increase your stamina and you will certainly remember more!

5. Have routines

Have you heard the phrase "a sound mind in a sound body"? Adopting that line of reason will get you far! Make sure to establish everyday routines, with healthy and varied eating habits, regular exercise and above all, make sure you get the sleep you need. A lack of routines can lead to unwanted feelings of stress or situations of "express-studying" the night before an exam.

In addition to being represented in the University boards and bodies, and given personal support, you as a member of the Union also get to attend seminars, clubs, and career days. You have the opportunity to take part in your favorite activities or to try out new ones through our associations. They offer everything from sports, parties and games to foreign politics. If you are new in town, this is a perfect opportunity to meet new friends who share your interests! You also get a student ID (Student card STUK and Mecenat card) and local discounts. Learn more about these on the next page. Another membership benefit that you can read more about on the next page is our weekly Soup Lunch and monthly Student Breakfast. It's hard to find a meal cheaper than that!

How do I join the Union?

The membership fee is 99 SEK per semester, you can also choose to buy a one-year-membership for 198 SEK. If you are a new member, and have never been registered in the Student Union before, you can easily register at our website malmostudenter.se/en/english/become-member. Follow the instructions on how to register and pay the fee. If you don't have a Swedish social security number, you can use the P or T number given to you by the University. This is found on your multi card. You pay via internet bank or by using your credit card. You can also get a paper invoice by emailing us at receptionen@malmostudenter.se. Once you've paid, your digital Student card STUK and Mecenat card will be sent to you within two working days.

During the first weeks of the semester you can become a member of the Student Union directly at your faculty. Your student ombud will be present at your faculty during this week and you have the opportunity to pay your membership.

As a student you get 15 percent discount at SJ, and up to 25 percent discount when you buy a ticket or a 30 days card with the Skånetrafiken app. Don't forget that you always have to carry your Mecenat- or Student card STUK when you travel. GET ENGAGED IN THE UNION

Getting involved in the Student Union is not only fun and a great way to meet new friends, it also gives you important experience for your future career. There are a variety of things to get involved in within the Student Union, choose the one that suits your interest best.

As a active member of the Student Union, you'll get the opportunity to get to know interesting people with similar interests as you, and chances are you'll make friends for life. You choose how much time you'll spend on your commitment, but some things take more time than others. Union involvement also gives you valuable experiences, and you will always receive a certificate stating that you have been active in the Student Union. This certificate provides you with a head start when you finish your education and begin to look for a job, as many employers see it as a big plus to have engaged alongside your studies.

To make your choice a bit easier, we have divided the Union's activities in two different parts. If you want to be involved in making important decisions both within the University and the Union, student influence and representation is your thing. For example, you can be a student representative in one of the University's committees, improve your education as a course or program representative, or influence the Union's work. Would you rather become awesome at planning events and activities, then student life is your thing. Take part in organizing everything from soup lunches to the Union's annual festival. The only one that limits what can be done is you!

Student influence and representation

The Student Union Council (FUM)

The word FUM is something you will hear a lot during your time of studies. The Student Union Malmö is governed by a council, which is elected by students. The council (FUM) - is the Union's highest decision-making body and is responsible for all decisions and all activities within the Union. FUM consists of 29 members. 19 of them are elected by students in the Union Election every spring, and 10 are elected at FORUM in the beginning of the fall semester. FUM meets five to six times a year and takes all general decisions for the entire year. Would you like to decide what the Union should work with? Then you should be a member of the student council.

Committees and bodies

The Union represents the students in all committees, groups and bodies of Malmö University. The student perspective is extremely important to the university and serves as a tool to improve education quality. The Union appoints representatives to these committees through five different meetings, called FORUM. For more information about FORUM please



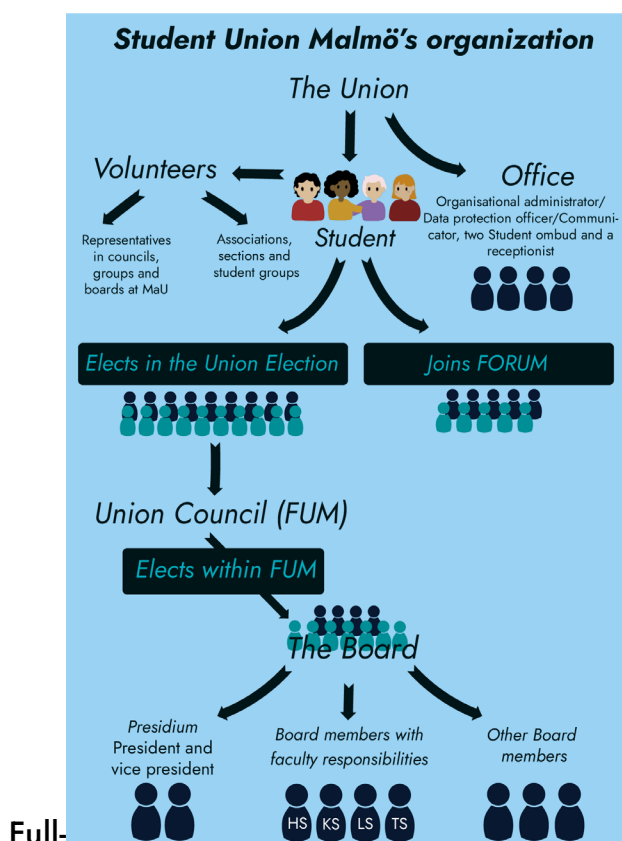

At your faculty

Parts of the Student Unions work in the faculties are conducted via the student committees. Each faculty has its own student committee consisting of dedicated students and the faculty's student ombud. You meet once a month and raise questions concerning your faculty. All students are welcome; contact your student ombud for more info.

At your program or course

Perhaps the most important part of student influence at Malmö University is the students' right to influence their own education. On all programs and courses there are course and program representatives. As a representative you forward your classmates' opinions and attend meetings that affect your education. Contact your student ombud for more information about how you can become the representative at your course or program.



time assignments at the Student Union

You also have the opportunity to work full time at the Union. The Union has a President and a Vice President who are full time remunerated, and have taken a break from their studies to work a year for the Union. To be able to get one of the positions, you must first be a candidate in the Union Election, become one of the 19 candidates elected for FUM and then apply for the position you want. A full-time assignment at the Union is stressful and demanding but also incredibly fun and enriching. You will attend important meetings, meet a lot of students and learn everything about Malmö University. If you don't want to be engaged full-time, you can be a board member with faculty responsibilities or a volunteer board member. For these positions, you will manage your studies on the side.

Union days

The event may vary slightly from month to month. Sometimes we have a special theme we focus on; perhaps we'll ask you to answer some questions; sometimes we bring along an interesting company; and we always treat student union members to coffee!

What is required of you?

MEET THE COUNCIL OF THE UNION

The Council (FUM) can be described as the Parliament of the Union. They are our highest decision-making body that makes all overall decisions that concern the entire Union.

FUM is appointed in the Union Election, where you as a member of the Union can candidate and all students at Malmö University can vote. In total, FUM consists of 29 students. 19 are elected through the Union Election and ten are added via FORUM in the autumn.

The Council meets three to four times per semester and the meetings are always on Wednesday afternoon starting at 16:00 and last two to three hours.

THE BOARDS OF THE UNION

If the Student Council is the Student Union's parliament, then the Board is its government. The Board currently consists of nine Student Council members who hold board meetings approximately twice a month. The Board's primary task is to ensure that the Student Council's decisions are implemented. This is a fantastic opportunity to learn more about how a board operates.

Presidium and Board members

The Presidium, consisting of a president and a vice president, leads the board meetings, prepares matters for decision, and represents the Student Union's members to the media and the outside world. To serve in a full-time position on the Presidium, you must take a leave of absence from your studies.

Four board members have important responsibilities toward the four faculties that the Student Union represents. They are an integral part of the Student Union and will play a key role as a crucial link between faculty leadership and the student representatives. These members continue their studies alongside their duties, but receive compensation for attending certain specific meetings.

The other three members' responsibility is to support the Presidium and committees with various tasks. They are also assigned specific areas of responsibility by the Board. This responsibility involves providing support for student social activities, recruiting student representatives, and organizing "Get Engaged."

Get to know your **STUDENT OMBUD**

If you have any questions or problems during your studies, you can always contact your faculty's student ombud. They will be more than happy to help you with both educational and extracurricular issues. Our ombuds have specific knowledge of the conditions at your particular faculty and are the first person you should turn to if you need help or support from the Union. The student ombuds are located both in the office building and in their offices at the faculties.

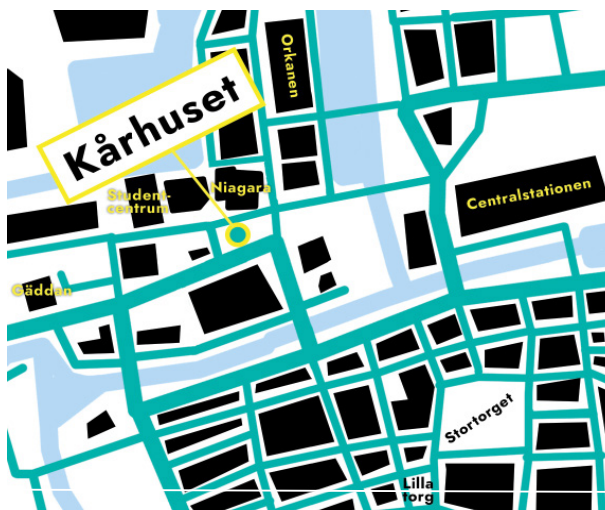
